15 day/14 nights, Fish collecting tour

The itinerary below is a guide and can be tailored to suit your preferences.

- **Day 1.** (½ day) Airport pick up and introduction to Go Wild Peru guides and staff. An optional guided visit to the town's market place and town centre. Welcome dinner.
- **Day 2.** Collecting area 1
- **Day 3**. Start of a three-day collecting trip to the home of Corydoras weitzmani, sampling various sites en-route.
- Day 4. Collecting C. weitzmani, this may involve several locations including some that have never before been sampled. A further option is available to take a day tour up into the high Andes, the home of alpaca, and where you will see fantastic scenery, including close up views of the glacier.
- **Day 5.** A further option is available to take a day tour up into the high Andes, the home of alpaca, and where you will see fantastic scenery, including close up views of the glacier.
- **Day 6.** Fish collecting area 3.
- **Day 7.** Return to Puerto Maldonado, collecting at the locations sampled on the outward journey.
- **Day 8.** Rest day free time after preparations for scientific export and water changes, visit town centre.
- **Day 9.** Fish collecting area 4.
- **Day 10.** Fish collecting area 5.
- **Day 11.** Visiting near local, newly formed trails. These may or may not be productive, but because these have not been visited by other than locals, there is every likelihood of discovering new never before seen species.
- **Day 12.** Fish collecting area 6.
- **Day 13.** Fish collecting area 7.
- **Day 14.** Last minute local collecting and final fish preparation.
- **Day 15** (½ day) Departure.
- **Pricing:** Prices start from \$2795.00 per person for bed, meals, transport, guiding fees and housekeeper services.
- **Note:** Days 1 & 15 are, because of flight schedules actually half days. Most flights in and out of Puerto Maldonado are around the middle of the day.

There would also be the added option to drive along the old Cusco road into the High Andes, where the stunning scenery along with some very interesting flora is something not to be missed.

The region is one of the most bio-diverse in South America and a would-be haven for anyone interested in Birds, Ornamental fish, Insects, Orchids, or Reptiles. The cloud forest and mountain scenery is stunning. There is also a well-appointed butterfly farm local to the GWP house, which is also well worth visiting.
